



WHAT IS THE INSPECTION & MAINTENANCE (I/M) PROGRAM ?

- Georgia's Clean Air Force (GCAF) is the state's Enhanced Vehicle Emission Inspection and Maintenance (I/M) Program.
- The program was created to reduce ozone-forming pollutants and particle pollution from the air we breathe and to produce a healthier environment in Georgia.
- The program is helping Georgia attain federal clean air standards.
- The annual number of vehicle's "cleaned up" has increased by 136 percent since the program's inspection in 1996.
- Close to 1.5 million vehicles have been "cleaned up" since the start of Georgia's Enhanced I/M Program in 1996. Approximately 2.5 million vehicles were tested in 2007.
- In 2009, Georgia's I/M program is predicted to remove the following approximate amounts of pollution (tons-per-summer-day reductions):
 - ▶ CO -- 316
 - ▶ VOC -- 19
 - ▶ NOx -- 19
- Currently there are more than 800 inspection stations with 900 test lanes in use at any one time.
