## ★ TO HELP DRIVERS ★ ACE THE EMISSIONS TEST



### PRO TIP

The most common reasons for emissions test failures can be checked and repaired during routine tune-ups. So, if you take proper care of your vehicle, you're off to a good start in passing the emissions test.

### 28-42 DAYS

Days prior to the registration renewal date for pre-emissions test vehicle preparation.



### 1996 & NEWER

Model year vehicles on which the check engine light may illuminate as a result of a loose fuel cap.

### 14 DAYS

Days a vehicle should be driven (city and highway) following check engine light reset.

### 30 DAYS

Days from a failed test in which motorists may receive a free retest at the original testing station.

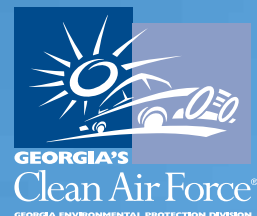
Parts of the emissions test:
